Have you ever noticed that sometimes it is hard to see or feel God's presence? I don't know about you but so often I get pulled into the business of each day and fail to notice that God is beside us in all that we are about. God gives us the freedom of choice to include him or go forth without acknowledging his role, therein lies our challenge.

Just, maybe this is what was behind seeing the day as a mystery and adventure, asking God to show his presence as we traveled together.

I'm convinced that our regular days are no different, but our focus is often so distracted and hijacked by the business of our normal days that God is left out. God is always near when we take time to notice. Being faithful people is about finding joy in celebrating God's presence in the simplest ways. Then not keeping those discoveries to ourselves, but making sure we acknowledge and appreciate them with others.

I hope you are excited about God's presence around you. I challenge you to see Christ's presence all around you, be it your drive to work, a bus ride to school, a walk in the park or taking the garbage out. God is beside you asking you to notice. His desire is to just want to bless your day!

A prayer: Thanks God for traveling with us in the mystery of our lives. Continue to surprise us in noting you in the simplest and most normal activities of our days. Thanks for being near always. Amen

Similar scams have been used to target other congregations in our synod as well claiming to come from the pastor of the respective congregation. Please carefully evaluate such e-mails and texts.

Council News from August:

(There was no September meeting due to opening day of Back to Wed School Party on the Grass & Wed Worship.)

Committee discussions held at the meeting included the following:

Worship Committee: Scandanavian Park Service was another successful time and attendance was higher than last year.

Education: Wed School teachers have been found. Could still use some substitutions.

Confirmation: Letters went out for this year's starting classes. First night for students is Sept 18th.

Ministry of Care: Doing Donation Station again in Sept. This year is another grant of \$500 if 1,000 pounds are raised.

Property Management: The landscaping has never looked better around the church.

Hostfest: Looking for volunteers yet. Scheduling will be done thru the office this year to hopefully save on people receiving phone calls. Volunteers should be trained in food handling per First District Health Unit. Bethany will schedule a class here.

BLCW: Rally Wed is Sept 11th and they will be helping supply food and drinks for the evening. Friends thru Faith will pick corn again. Should be a fun evening.

Old Business: Metigoshe Capital Campaign headed up by Ariel Hirzel. There will be 5 weeks of information handed out. Carpet fund is still raising money with a goal of \$10,000 and they are at \$8,600 currently. CHIF will cover any additional funding needed. Preschool starts on Sept 3rd. Enrollment is at 15.

New Business: Western ND Synod Survey needs to be completed tonight and emailed to the Synod. This involves questions of Electing a new Synod Bishop in 2020. Council members gave good discussions on the questions that the Synod is asking.

Council will again meet on the scheduled day of Wednesday, October 9th at 7:30 pm.
