CAUSE OF THE MONTH: Our cause of the month for June is mission support for **Lutheran Social Services**.

Bethany protocol for below remains unchanged due to the uptick of numbers of positive Covid in the state.

In-person worship has started, **at 8:30 AM**. For those who would like to gather but are not comfortable indoors, or if we run out of space inside, we will also offer a Bring-your-own-Lawn-chair worship outside on the north parking lot at 10:30 AM. If you have underlying health conditions such as heart or lung disease, asthma, diabetes, etc. If you have a fever, cough, or are not feeling well, stay home.

For indoor worship, cloth masks worn at all times. We have a few extra to distribute if you come without a mask. A mask is not to protect ourselves, but to protect our neighbor. **For outdoor worship, masks are optional.**

Only Door #3 will be open. The rest of the church will be roped off from use. Social distancing will be observed at all times, family groups may sit together. Hand sanitizer will be provided in the worship traffic area. **Worship:** No gathering in Narthex (before or after worship). Maximum sanctuary capacity 50 (based on every other pew – or 13 pews, and seating on the outside end of each pew). Seating will be in a specific order – starting with the front pews first. To exit, the back rows will be dismissed first. Congregation singing is not allowed, hymns will be sung by designated song-leader. We will avoid all physical contact during Sharing of the Peace, no shaking hands. We will not hand out bulletins for inside service. Offering can be placed in a basket at the entrance to the sanctuary; online giving is encouraged. A new method of distributing communion will be introduced. No coffee hour or fellowship. Hold outdoor worship as possible, weather permitting. Continue online live worship once a week throughout summer, 8:30 AM and available anytime afterwards.
